



Medicaid Eligibility During COVID-19

Colorado must keep certain people on Medicaid until the end of the COVID-19 public health emergency.

The public health emergency ends **October 18, 2021**. It has been extended several times and will likely continue through the end of the year.

This means:

- If you **were eligible for Medicaid on March 18, 2020**, you will continue to receive Medicaid benefits for the duration of the public health emergency.
- If you **become eligible for Medicaid after March 18, 2020**, you will receive Medicaid benefits for the duration of the public health emergency.
- If your **Medicaid benefits were terminated** with an effective date of **March 31, 2020, or after**, your benefits should have been restored. You will continue to receive benefits for the duration of the public health emergency.

There are limited circumstances where Medicaid can be terminated. If your Medicaid was reduced, terminated, or denied, feel free to contact our office. CLS provides free legal services to low income clients and seniors.
